

#### Opening words of praise with lighting of 3 candles -

I will light a light in the name of the Maker, who lit the world and gave everything life.

I will light a light in the name of the Son, who saved the world and stretched out his hand to me.

I will light a light in the name of the Spirit, who is present everywhere in the world and gives me strength.

Together: We will light three lights for the trinity of love: God above us, God beside us, God beneath us; The beginning, The end and the Everlasting one.





These resources are to help equip & enable worship together as "family". They are intentionally intergenerational to allow space, conversation, activity & response together as the family of God. We encourage all ages to be participative & open, being responsive to God and each other.

Reflection time: What brings you joy? Share with those who you are gathered with stories of when you felt joyful or happy – what or who was it that gave you that feeling of being joyful/happy. On a piece of paper draw those moments, people, or stories collectively to create a "JOY COLLAGE"



#### Bible passage: Read together John 1.6-8 & 19-28

Now is the time to light the first, second & third candle on an advent wreath if you have one or colour the 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>sd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> candle below. As you light or colour the candles you could use the Interactive family prayer on the next sheet. The third candle reminds us that lasting Joy is found in life on earth with Jesus Christ. All other joy is fleeting and does not last very long but the joy of Jesus can and does remain with us; we just need to remind ourselves at times. We are all known and called by God, John the Baptist was called by God to tell people of Jesus who was to come after him. In the other gospels it focuses more on WHAT Jesus taught and did, but in Johns gospel it focuses more on WHO Jesus is, John the Baptist told people about Jesus being the light in a dark world – we are also called to light in a dark world and to share the joy of Jesus.

#### Interactive Learning.....

This picture will be on the sheet every week during Advent – Todays candle is **JOY** but don't forget to colour the previous 2 candles reminding us of God's HOPE & PEACE

#### Create a Jar of Joy

Decorate an empty jar and encourage people to write on a small length of paper a way in which you can experience joy. These can range from going to the beach together, sharing sweets, making someone a cup of tea, giving a family member a hug, cooking dinner, going out for dinner, walk in the park together etc.



Continue to fill your jar with messages of joy over the next few weeks then in 2021 take out a "joy" & make it happen.

#### An Interactive Family Advent Prayer

Some families enjoy saying prayers and blessings as they light a candle on the wreath each Sunday. This is an example of an interactive family prayer:

Person 1: Lord, you are the light of the world.

Person 2: O Come, O Come, Emmanuel. Person 1/3: Heavenly Father, we long for your plan of rescue and redemption to be realized. Give us hearts that see your beauty and wait in hope for you to make all things good and new again.

Person 2/4: O Come, O Come, Emmanuel.

Person 1/5: May your light and love shine brightly in our hearts, spreading hope and peace to those around us. All: Amen.

This week, we're delighted to share with you our new report, Stories of Hope Scotland, which was developed in partnership with Serve Scotland. The report found that churches across Scotland have delivered 212,214 individual acts of support during lockdown with the help of more than 3,000 volunteers.

Churches across the UK have tirelessly shown Christ-like service to those in need this year, and it's great to be able to spotlight some of these stories of hope that have come from Scotland. We are sure your spirits will be lifted as you read the report on our website Wonderfully, a copy has been sent to every single Member of the Scottish Parliament. ## The Comparison Trap by Helen Roberts




In The Comparison Trap Helen explores the complexities of female relationships.
