Gather.....

- As you gather find a place that is comfortable and have the resources readv for the activities, prayer or response times ready.
- Choose 3 members to light the 3 candles (engage all ages)

Opening words of praise with lighting of 3 candles -

I will light a light in the name of the Maker. who lit the world and gave everything life.

I will light a light in the name of the Son, who saved the world and stretched out his hand to me.

I will light a light in the name of the Spirit, who is present everywhere in the world and gives me strength.

Together: We will light three lights for the trinity of love: God above us. God beside us. God beneath us; The beginning, The end and the Everlasting one.

Welcome.....

Say together: Hallelujah, He is risen He is risen indeed, Hallelujah.

Reflection time: Hide items that represent Easter i.e., Eggs=new life, white cloth=grace & resurrection, cross=victory, pebble=the tomb, toy lamb= Jesus the lamb of God. Send people off to find the hidden items, once back together ask, what is the connection?

Bible passage: Read Together John 20.1-18

When Mary finds that the stone has been removed from the tomb she jumps to conclusions. She thinks that someone has entered and stolen the body. But in our reading it does not tell us if she entered or even looked in the tomb.

Did she really know that the body of Jesus was not there?

How often do we jump to conclusions about God's actions in our lives?

Mary is questioning & wondering "Where has my Lord gone?" When Jesus speaks to her she instantly recognises him, Jesus called Mary specifically by her name. As we celebrate Easter let us instantly recognise Jesus in our lives, let him call us by name and let him reveal himself to us and work in our lives.

Interactive Learning.....

Coloured Cross

Draw a cross outline using white glue on paper (looks better on dark colours) and while the glue is wet cover it with salt. Gently tip off the excess. Then colour the salt by gently dabbing dilute water colours over the salt. Food colouring works too. Watch carefully as the colour spreads throughout the salt, transforming the edges of the cross.





Easter & Hallelujah Rocks

Collect smooth rocks or pebbles and paint an Easter Scene, or something that reminds you of Jesus' amazing love through his sacrifice for us. You could also try using tissue paper to create bright Hallelujah rocks to give away to share Jesus' love around your community.



Family Messy Eggs

Hard-boiled Easter eggs can be dyed in assorted Easter colours. Everyone must stand at least 3 feet away from each other and toss the eggs back and forth. Anyone who drops an egg is out. Intensity may be added to this game by using raw eggs as a surprise. Players can step back away from each other during every turn. The person left standing at the end of the game, who has not dropped a single egg, is the winner.




Goodnight World by Rebecca Parkinson
